### Spotlight on Incarcerated Parents

In 2023, Colorado passed <u>Incarcerated Parents Bill (SB23-039)</u>, which goes into effect early in 2024. We'd encourage you to take a look at this Colorado Sun article <u>A new Colorado law</u> <u>offers protection for rights of parents in prison</u> <u>(coloradosun.com)</u> on this legislation and to think about how your BPCT will prepare for this requirement along with what might shift for your practice from a philosophical standpoint. On December 14, 2023, the Colorado Supreme Court unanimously approved a set of ICWA rules developed by a multidisciplinary team to be effective on January 1, 2024.
